GATSBY CAREER BENCHMARKS

1	A stable careers programme	Every school and college should have an embedded programme of career education and guidance that is known and understood by students, parents, teachers, governors and employers.
2	Learning from career and labour market information	Every student, and their parents, should have access to good quality information about future study options and labour market opportunities. They will need the support of an informed adviser to make best use of available information.
3	Addressing the needs of each student	Students have different career guidance needs at different stages. Opportunities for advice and support need to be tailored to the needs of each student. A school's careers programme should embed equality and diversity considerations throughout
4	Linking curriculum learning to careers	All teachers should link curriculum learning with careers. STEM subject teachers should highlight the relevance of STEM subjects for a wide range of future career paths.
5	Encounters with employers and employees	Every student should have multiple opportunities to learn from employers about work, employment and the skills that are valued in the workplace. This can be through a range of enrichment activities including visiting speakers, mentoring and enterprise schemes.
6	Experiences of workplaces	Every student should have first-hand experiences of the workplace through work visits, work shadowing and/or work experience to help their exploration of career opportunities and expand their networks.
7	Encounters with further and higher education	All students should understand the full range of learning opportunities that are available to them. This includes both academic and vocational routes and learning in schools, colleges, universities and in the workplace.
8	Personal guidance	Every student should have opportunities for guidance interviews with a career adviser, who could be internal (a member of school staff) or external, provided they are trained to an appropriate level. These should be available whenever significant study or career choices are being made.

The Gatsby Benchmarks are a framework of 8 guidelines that define the best careers provision in secondary schools.






Year 10 and 12 students completed their work experience placements in July.

They tackled a team challenge with the amazing Construction Youth Trust, sharpening their teamwork, problemsolving and presentation skills through developing a design project and presenting their ideas to staff. Additionally, they participated in a virtual work experience program with Springpod, exploring exciting career opportunities.

We were delighted to welcome John from The National Farmers Union who shared his knowledge of careers in farming and agriculture. Our students were curious about the qualifications required to work in farming and agriculture and were fascinated by the freshly cut wheat that John brought with him. John provided some links that might be beneficial for investigating the range of careers in agriculture: Prospects and Agriculture and related sciences (UCAS.com).

On Tuesday, they took part the Make it Make Sense Day with Charlton Athletic where they looked at their futures and the journey that will allow them to flourish.

On Wednesday, we took students to the Creative Careers Festival at Dreamland Margate where they attended workshops by Amazon, Tiktok and other creative professionals in the industry.

On Thursday, students completed a Carbon Footprint Project where they had to devise ways of reducing their carbon footprints and present their project plans to their peers. They also received Science and English linked careers lessons.

On Friday, students were visited by Steve from The Royal Air Force who led them through the Personal Development Training which incorporated leadership, teamwork, integrity and resilience through a range of activities in the sports hall. FREE Clearing and Results Day Webinar

The Clearing and Results Day webinar will see representatives from four universities giving presentations explaining major aspects of the clearing and results day process and answering any questions so students are fully prepared for later that month. **REGISTER HERE**.

What is Clearing?

<u>Clearing</u> is a second chance to get a place at university this year. It is an annual process that begins in July and runs through September where courses reopen applications to fill their available spaces.

Clearing is for students who:

- Didn't receive any offers when they applied earlier in the year.
- · Declined all their original offers.
- Don't meet their conditional offers on results day, or do better than expected.
- Late applicants: those who didn't apply or missed the original deadline.

<u>A-Level Results Day 2024</u> is Thursday 15th August. The status of their firmed choice should update on the UCAS Hub at around 8am.

It will either say: 'Unconditional' if their place is approved, 'Unsuccessful' if they've not met the grades, or 'Unconditional Changed Course' if they've not met the grades, but their uni has suggested a different course with lower requirements.

What to do if your child doesn't get the grades they need:

- If they are still interested in attending university this year, they can log into their UCAS Hub and search for available Clearing courses.
- Encourage them to do their research don't rush into selecting a new university.
- They should phone places they are interested in, give them their Clearing Number & UCAS ID (available on the UCAS Hub), and confirm they are able to accept your child.
- They can then add a Clearing choice to their online UCAS application. 25th September is the deadline for new 2024 UCAS applications, and 21st October is the deadline to add Clearing choices.

GCSE Results Day can be a day of celebration or worry. We hope that your child got the grades they expected, is happy with their choice for education or training for the next academic year and has confirmed their place.

Current Saint George's students who wish to join our sixth form will be able to enrol with a member of the sixth form team and take up a confirmed place during results day.

If things haven't gone to plan and they need further support to make their decision or find a suitable course, we have provided some guidance below.

What Should You Do Next?

- Contact the school/college/training or apprenticeship provider who had initially offered your child a place.
- They may still accept them or have an alternative option available.
- Contact your child's current school for support and to discuss alternative options.
- Make direct contact with another school/college/training or apprenticeship provider to see if they have opportunities available.

UCAT Bookings - Hull York Medical School

At Hull York Medical School, we require applicants to have completed the University Clinical Aptitude Test (UCAT) the admissions test used by a consortium of UK universities for their medical degree programmes.

The UCAT helps universities to select applicants with the most appropriate skills, attitudes and professional behaviours required to be successful doctors and dentists.

Booking and preparing for your test UCAT bookings are now open, and tests should be booked through the applicant's **UCAT Account**. For more information about booking a test, please visit the UCAT website. The UCAT tests run between 18 June and 19 September 2024 (subject to availability), in Pearson Vue testing centres throughout the UK and internationally.

Students can only take the test once, so make sure they allow plenty of time to prepare, using the free Official UCAT preparation resources and practice tests.

If your students are eligible for the UCAT bursary to cover their test fee, we recommend they apply for it, as we take this into consideration when scoring applications.

And if they qualify for extra time, rest breaks or any other accommodations in public exams, then make sure to submit an application for these Access Arrangements before booking their test



The online sessions will be based on the KMMS (Kent and Medway Medical School) curriculum and go through topics such as Heart, Lungs and Blood; Health and Disease; Neuroscience and Behaviour; Immune System; and many more.

CAREER ZONE: JOBS IN FOOTBALL



Could I really start a career in football?

If you've got a flair for the beautiful game – yes! The <u>level 3</u> sporting excellence professional apprenticeship (equivalent to A-level) is a great way for 16-18 year olds to get into football. Almost half of football apprentices go on to pursue a professional career.

So what is the professional sport apprenticeship?

- How long is it? 18 months 2 years.
- Who trains me? You will be trained at a club in your chosen sport (such as Football, Rugby, or Equestrianism).
- What qualifications will I get? Sporting excellence professional, BTEC sporting excellence and performance, Functional skills, Certificate in coaching.
- What happens next? In the second half of year two, clubs decide which apprentices to offer contracts to.
- What if I don't get a contract? You will get support to apply for other opportunities, such as placements in the US or Europe.

What about other sports jobs?


- Community activator coach: Help keep your community active, fit and healthy you can train for this role through a <u>level 2 apprenticeship</u>
- Sports coach: You could train and coach sportspeople through a level 4 apprenticeship.
- Sports turf operative: Look after sports grounds, from international stadiums to local clubs, with a <u>level 2 sports</u> <u>turf operative apprenticeship.</u>


