

Maths

Fractions: The children will begin this block by exploring the denominators of unit fractions. From Year 2, they know about halves, quarters and thirds and they will now look at fractions with other denominators. They will grow to understand that a fraction can be seen as part of a whole and that to find a unit fraction, they divide the whole into equal parts.

Mass and Capacity: in this block the children will learn to use and understand scales. This small step provides opportunity for the children to become more familiar with using scales to read measurements.

English

- **Fiction Text:** *Toys Go Out*, *Something told the wild geese (Poem)* and *Flotsam* by David Wiesner

The main aim in writing for two of our texts are persuasion. Starting with *Toys Go Out* where the children will explore and create persuasive adverts for their favourite toys. Then with *Flotsam*, the children will be creating persuasive posters persuading others to keep our beaches clean. We will additionally be looking at poetry with *Something told the wild geese*. This text will be used to influence writing through explanation intending to inform audiences.
