## Remote Learning Day 2<sup>nd</sup> November 2021

Following the letter on 15<sup>th</sup> October, a reminder that **Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> November** will be a remote learning day for all students in Years 7-10 and Year 12. Years 11 and 13 will continue with their scheduled PPEs on site as per the exam timetable. A reminder also that there will be very limited onsite provision for children who are unable to remain at home on that day. This will be a supervised computer room allowing access to the online learning. If your child requires this provision, please email <u>remotelearning@saintgeorgescofe.kent.sch.uk</u> to let us know the circumstances that require your child to be onsite.

On the day, all remote learning will be accessed via Microsoft TEAMS. Your child has used this platform for accessing homework this year and in the cases of Year 8 to Year 13, used this platform for remote learning during the previous

On the day, all students will have live registration with their tutor at 8.40am. Students are then expected to follow their timetable for the day (Tuesday week A). Your children will be taught live lessons in the following subjects:

- Science
- Computer Science
- Art
- Technology
- BTEC PE

• Some Geography, History and RE (this is dependent on their teacher, and it will be clear on their TEAMs calendar on the day)

For all other lessons, students will be set work on TEAMS (this may include a pre-recorded lesson) and will be expected to complete it during the timetabled lesson).
